<p><b><u>'Rainbow' Hunt</u></b> <b><u>Weekly Scavenger Hunt</u></b> Can you take part in this weeks <b>'Out on your walk' Scavenger Hunt?</b> You will find this attached on Google Classroom. Let us know how you get! 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Pick an Audio Book</u></b> Log on to <a href="https://stories.audible.com/start-listen">https://stories.audible.com/start-listen</a> Choose an audiobook to read for free! Afterwards, you could discuss what your favourite part of the story was and explain why. You could even illustrate your favourite part and write a sentence about it, if you like! 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Pick a Plant</u></b> Venture outdoors to look for a plant or flower that you like the look of. Can you draw a picture of your plant or flower and name its different parts? You could even write the names of each part next to them on your diagram. Key words: roots, leaf, stem and flower. 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Home Learning Pack Materials</u></b> Keep using your home learning pack materials. If you have completed/used all of these, please use the list attached on Google Classroom to help you with fun new ways of using your sounds, words and number flashcards 😊</p>
<p><b><u>Piece it Together</u></b> Choose three words (or more if you like) from one of your reading books. Using an old magazine, cut out the letters that you need and stick them onto a piece of paper to make the words. Then, write each word in your nest handwriting next to them. 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Test an Adult</u></b> Using your common words flash cards, test an adult by seeing if they can spell your common words. Did they get it correct? You could even use your sound cards to build your own words to test your adult on. Good luck! 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Draw a View</u></b> Have a look out your window and draw a picture of what you see. Try to include as many details as possible and add some colour! I wonder what you will see... You can even share your window view with your friends on Google Classroom! 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Alphabet Hunt</u></b> Find items in your house or outdoors that begin with the letters A-Z. You can share photographs of your items or even write a list of each of the items that you find that begin with each letter. Have fun! 😊</p>
<p><b><u>RM Easimaths</u></b> Log on to RM Easimaths through Glow and play. Let's see who can master some new Numeracy skills 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Light or Heavy?</u></b> Can you find objects around your house and sort them into whether they feel 'light' or 'heavy'? Then, sort the objects according to which are 'lightest', 'light', 'heavy' and 'heaviest'. Good luck! 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Time talks: Months of the Year</u></b> How many months of the year are there? It might help to sing the 'Months of the Year' song to an adult at home! Write down your birthday month. Can you find out the birthday month of someone at home too? Write down as many as you like! 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Exercise Challenge</u></b> Think of an exercise that you can do in your home. Get an adult to time you and see how many times you can do the exercise in one minute. Can you time someone at home to see how many times they can do it too? 😊</p>
<p><b><u>How does it End?</u></b> After reading one of your ORT books or one of your story books at home, have a little think about how the story ends. Can you think of another way that the story might end and write about it? You could even illustrate how the story would end too if you like! 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Dice Addition</u></b> Using a dice, roll it to get the first number, roll it again to get the second number and add them together. You can record your sums using the template that will be provided on Google Classroom. You could even use the dice template to create your own dice that you can add your own numbers to! 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Catch and Count</u></b> Find an object that you can pass between yourself and an adult. Pick a starting number and call out the next number when the object is passed to you. How high can you count? 😊</p>	<p><b><u>Keep Up the Kindness!</u></b> Do something kind for someone. Can you pay them a compliment, make them something or help out with a task? Share your acts of kindness with your friends on Google Classroom. 😊</p>
