Literacy

- Daily spelling – Use the Spelling Strategies to practise your words. You can then choose a different fun with spelling activity each day but keep practising the same words. Weekly spelling words will be posted on Seesaw at the beginning of each week.
- 20-30 minutes reading for enjoyment every day. This could be reading quietly on your own, reading to a pet, reading with a parent or sibling.
- Clarifying activity – after you have read a chapter in your book, find words that you did not know the meaning of and write down what they mean. Use a dictionary to help you or ask an adult.
- Descriptive words and phrases activity – listen to Roald Dahl's BFG, read by David Walliams. How does Roald Dahl grab your attention? What descriptive words and phrases are used to keep you wanting to listen?
- Spelling Test Friday! Ask an adult/sibling to test you on your spelling words for this week.
- Writing activity – Research and compare the facts between Queen Victoria and Queen Elizabeth II using the fact file template that will be posted on Seesaw.

Numeracy and Maths

- Complete the 2 Numeracy activities posted on Seesaw.
- Play Prodigy/ Easimaths/Sumdog as often as you like.
- Beyond Number maths activity – Tessellation – Information on the task and activities will be posted on Seesaw.
